Councilman Neyhart presented the *Employee of the Year* Award to Ernst Napoleon. Mayor Tucci thereafter proclaimed April 18, 2018, as *Ernst Napoleon Day* in the Borough of West Long Branch.

Chief Habermann and Lieutenant Gomez presented the following citations/awards to various members of the West Long Branch Police Department.

Unit Citation: Participation while in the performance of duty which, through teamwork, diligence and perseverance results in an exemplary outcome.

Unit Citation # 1:

Recipients: Sgt. William Lynch, Ptl. Nicholas Ferrugiaro, Ptl. Jeffrey Hanlon, Det. Jayson Moore, Det. Laura Osborn, Ptl. Jason Buono, Ptl. Tyler Brennessel, and Ptl. Kevin Stroebel.

On 1/13/2017 at about 11:42 pm Officers Ferrugiaro, Hanlon and Stroebel along with Officers from Oceanport PD responded to the La Quinta Hotel for reports of shots fired. While on route to the location, Ptl. Hanlon located a subject walking east on Hwy 36 near the Gas Land gas station and Ptl. Stroebel, assisted by Oceanport Police, located another subject near the BP Gas Station. At the time both subjects indicated they were the victims of the shooting and refused to cooperate. One subject had a warrant and was arrested. After posting bail he was released.

Meanwhile, Ptl. Ferrugiaro located the crime scene on the property of La Quinta and the investigation began. At about 4am on 1/14/18 it was determined that two other males had been shot while in a vehicle in the parking lot of the La Quinta and had driven themselves to Monmouth Medical Center seeking treatment.

The Officers working day shift on 1/14/17, Sgt. Lynch, Ptl. Brennessel, and Ptl. Buono performed a search of the wooded area around the La Quinta Hotel. Ptl. Buono discovered a handgun in the woods, which was later linked to the shooting. Ptl. Brennessel located additional shell casings which were also linked to the shooting.

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Det. Moore and Det. Osborn along with members of several other agencies, worked tirelessly investigating this incident. Several road blocks were encountered including totally uncooperative victims. Video surveillance from La Quinta showed two men firing on the victim's vehicle. The suspects who were originally located near the scene were the shooters as they matched the descriptions of the men in the video. Both males were apprehended and criminally charged. The defense counsel approached the MCPO about resolving the case. They offered 10 years then 12 years then 15 years; each offer was rejected based on the strength of our case and the hard work we have all put in. On Monday March 5th, 2018 desperate to avoid a trial, the defendants took the extraordinary step of standing up in court and pleading guilty to every count of the indictment without a plea deal from the state. In doing so, the cowardly defendants are hoping the judge will give them some consideration at the time of sentencing. Specifically, each defendant pleaded guilty to two counts of first degree Attempted Murder, two counts of second degree Aggravated Assault, one count each of second degree Possession of a Weapon for an Unlawful Purpose, second degree Unlawful Possession of a Weapon, second degree Certain Persons Not to Have Weapons, and fourth degree Refusal to Provide a DNA Sample.

Unit Citation #2:

Recipients: Sgt. Marlowe Botti, Ptl. Nicholas Ferrugiaro, Ptl. Jason Buono and Ptl. David Brosonski

On 10/24/2017 Sgt. Botti and Officers Ferrugiaro, Buono and Brosonski responded to a report of an agitated male throwing things in the community room of Peter Cooper Village. The Officers located the emotionally disturbed male who was acting violently and stating he did not want to talk to anyone. The male further stated he would kill himself and others if they intervened. The Officers were able to de-escalate the situation by speaking calmly and listening to the male. The male did calm down and stopped yelling, unfortunately, he tried to walk away but was detained by Officers with compliance holds. The male was then transported to Monmouth Medical Center for evaluation and treatment by the West Long Branch First Aid Squad. No one was injured during this incident.

Life Saving Award: Alert Action resulting in saving a life:

Life Saving Award #1:

On 9/23/2017 at about 9:20 in the morning the Officers were dispatched to the parking lot in front of the Urgent Care on Monmouth Rd/Rt 36 for a report of "possible deceased subject in a vehicle". Upon arrival the Officers found the staff of the urgent care unsuccessfully trying to resuscitate the victim a 50 year of female. Officers removed the patient from the vehicle, took over performing CPR and deployed the defibrillator. After several shocks from the defibrillator and minutes of CPR the victim regained pulses. The victim was turned over to the WLBFA and Medics who transported her to Monmouth Medical Center, where she was admitted to the Intensive Care Unit in Critical Condition.

Life Saving Award#2:

Recipients: Ptl. Scott Rockhill, Ptl. Ryan Buck

On 12/14/2017 at about 11:10 in the morning the Officers were dispatched to a home for a report of a 75-year-old female "awake but unresponsive". Upon arrival the Officers found the female on a couch, not breathing and had no pulse. CPR was started, and the defibrillator was deployed. After about 20 minutes of CPR, with the assistance of EMT's and Paramedics the female regained her pulse. Upon arrival at Monmouth Medical Center the female was admitted to the Intensive Care Unit in Critical Condition.

On 4/29/17 at about 9 in the morning, Officers were dispatched to the Norwood Room of the WLB Community Center in reference to a report of flooding. The Officer located a female who was present to decorate the room her child’s first birthday party and discovered the room flooded, from the previous night’s rain storms. The Officers were able to locate a shop vacuum and a mop/bucket and proceeded to clean up the water. All three Officers chipped in and purchased paper and cloth towels to clean up the mess. The manager of the WLB Community Center, emailed the Department to thank Sgt. Botti and her squad for going “above and beyond to help our renters and us rectify the situation.”

NEW YORK SMSA LIMITED PARTNERSHIP d/b/a VERIZON WIRELESS (ZB 2015-1); 175 Monmouth Road (Block 67, Lots 1 & 2). The Board granted D(1) use variance relief, bulk (“C”) variance relief, and preliminary and final site plan approval, to allow installation of the rooftop wireless telecommunication facilities at the “strip mall” at issue.

BG MONMOUTH, LLC (ZB 2015-14); 310 Highway 36 (Block 67, Lot 8.01). The Board granted D(1) use variance relief to permit the operation of a “pet hotel” (day camp and overnight boarding facility), veterinary clinic, and pet grooming salon, in association with and within the confines of the **PETSMART** retail pet supply store unit at the subject shopping center, along with a waiver of site plan review/approval.

SOLLY ARAMAN (ZB 2016-15); 101 Larchwood Avenue (Block 40, Lot 1). The Board granted variance relief to permit a 4 feet high fence along a portion of the Woodland Avenue frontage, whereas the ordinance otherwise limits fence height to 3 feet in front yard areas.

EDWARD DeROSA (ZB 2015-09); 43 Summers Avenue (Block 71, Lots 25 & 26). The Board granted relief for deficient existing lot area, deficient existing lot width, and deficient front yard setback, to permit expansion of the existing single-family dwelling at the subject property.

CHESTER DeOLIVEIRA (ZB 2015-11); 12 Lawrence Avenue (Block 37, Lot 9). The Board granted variance relief for excess lot coverage to permit installation of an in-ground pool at the site.

R-15 Zone

Martin McDonald Development Group, LLC (ZB 2016-09); Wall Street & Elmwood Avenue (Block 23, Lots 1, 2, 3, 22.01, 24, 25 & 26). This multi-family residential project was the subject of a 2006 Zoning Board approval permitting an 18 unit, age-restricted townhouse development at the site. The “Permit Extension Act” carried the approvals forward for a number of years. In 2011, the applicant submitted an application to the Board pursuant to the “Conversion Act”, NJSA 45:22A-46.3 et seq., seeking to “convert” the 2006 approvals for the age-restricted townhouse project into a non-age-restricted development. The Board denied the “Conversion Act” application. Litigation ensued, which litigation was tentatively settled subject to a “Whispering Woods” hearing. At the conclusion of the “Whispering Woods” hearing, the Board granted D(1) use variance relief, density variance relief, bulk variance relief, and site plan approval, to permit a 16 unit, market-rate, non-age-restricted, townhouse project at the site.

THOMAS D’AMBRISI (ZB 2016-0211); 11 Dennis Street (Block 28, Lot 43). The Board granted variance relief for deficient existing lot area and deficient front yard setback, to permit construction of a wrap-around front porch for the single-family dwelling at the subject property.

JOSEPH BOGNER & DANIELLE BOGNER (ZB 2016-07); 46 Maryland Avenue

(Block 16, Lot 6). The Board granted variance relief for deficient existing lot width, deficient front yard setback, and deficient side yard setbacks, to permit expansion of the single-family dwelling at the subject property.

R-10 Zone

CYNTHIA LAUGHLIN (ZB 2016-13); 15 Thompson Street (Block 108, Lot 32). The Board granted variance relief to permit the proposed new garage to have a side yard setback of 3.1 feet (consistent with the side yard setback of the existing garage), whereas a setback of 14.5 feet is otherwise required.

DANA GUSZTAW & DAMON GUSZTAW (ZB 2016-08); 71 Victor Avenue (Block 10, Lot 22). The Board granted variance relief for existing deficient lot area, existing deficient lot width, and proposed combined side yard setback deficiency of 23.4 feet, whereas 30 feet is otherwise required (but whereas 6.3 feet currently exists), to permit demolition of the existing dwelling at the subject property, and construction of a new single-family residence.

JACKIE CRESPO (ZB 2016-16); 34 North Locust Avenue (Block 108, Lot 40). The Board granted variance relief for proposed deficient total combined side yard setbacks to permit expansion of the existing single-family dwelling at the subject property.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Michael Pagones, 117 Larchwood Avenue, appeared this evening concerning the Monmouth University football stadium and the process of approval. He commented that he attended all of the Board meetings on this matter and that University representatives testified that the new stadium would have small, ground-level speakers emitting 65 dba sound power. The Zoning Board agreed to make that a requirement of approval and University representatives agreed to implement those types of speakers. According to Mr. Pagones, those speakers were never implemented nor installed. He has measured the sound at 85 dba, which is 20 db above what was approved. Mr. Pagones requested that the Mayor and Council investigate this matter and take appropriate action.

Gerry Fawcett, Beechwood Avenue, agreed with Mr. Pagones' comments and stated that she could hear the noise from the stadium as well.

Terry Moran, 23 Sherman Avenue, inquired about the availability of FIOS in West Long Branch. Councilman Neyhart informed him that bringing FIOS to West Long Branch was a project of Councilman Penta, who met with representatives of Verizon and found that it is not an option and that Verizon is now exploring new technology.

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There being no one else wishing to speak, on motion made by Councilman Neyhart, seconded by Councilman Bray, and carried unanimously, the meeting was adjourned at 8:58 PM.
